

MiCareerQuest Northeast is the largest one-day, career exploration event for high school students held in our region.

1,500+ students from **24** schools in an 11 county region (Alcona, Alpena, Cheboygan, Crawford, Iosco, Montmorency, Ogemaw, Oscoda, Otsego, Presque Isle, and Roscommon) are attending MiCareerQuest NE.

There are **53** exhibiting organizations, showcasing more than **125** in-demand jobs in four industry quadrants: construction, healthcare, manufacturing, and technology.

Over **80** volunteers from Michigan Works! agencies, partner organizations, local community groups, and other groups are on-hand to make sure the event runs smoothly.

More than **200** working professionals are participating in the event. They have spent the past several months designing interactive demonstrations designed to engage students and highlight the skills needed to succeed.

MiCareerQuest Northeast is modeled after similar events held over the past seven years across Michigan.


